- Rent based for 1 person occupancy, for extra person a fee for +25€/ person / month is billed

Examples for the rent of a 21 m² studio at 553 € and for a 28m² one-bedroom apartment at 681 €.

What do you have to pay to get an apartment ?

- There are administration fees to pay at the reservation: **300 € for a studio** and 300 € for a one-bedroom apartment.
- The monthly rent for a 21 m² studio is **553 €** (charges and water included – free internet), 729 € for the one-bedroom apartment of 28 m² with balcony.
- In addition to the rent you have to pay the electricity: about 40€ per month ; the garbage collection tax: about 100€ per year.
- And the security deposit that corresponds to one month fee : **553 € for a 21m² studio** or 681 € for the one-bedroom apartment. The security deposit is given back to you less than 2 months after your departure. When you leave, if the apartment isn't as clean as it was when you arrived, or if something is broken, the price of cleaning/repairing is taken from the security deposit.

What is provided in the apartment?

- 2 beds (trundle bed) of 80 by 190 cm with a mattress
- A nightstand
- A desk, a table and 2 chairs
- Closets and storage units
- A bathroom with toilet
- A kitchen

In the kitchen you have:

- A fridge
- Electrical cooking plates
- A microwave oven
- A coffeepot
- Pots, cutlery, glasses, etc...
- Cupboards

What do you necessarily have to bring with you or to buy here?

- A mattress cover
- A blanket
- A pillow
- Bedcovers

- **In the residence Bel Air, we give you free access to the Bike rack. We also have a paying Laundry room (Washing: 3,20€ - Drying: 2€). We can lend you a vacuum cleaner, iron and iron board.**

The supermarkets (Carrefour, E.Leclerc) are just in front of the residence, you can go there walking.

CAF (Caisse d'Allocations Familiales)

The CAF is an organization of the French government which gives a financial support to all students living in France. You will receive a certain amount of money (at least 190€) every month called ALS (Allocation Logement Social).

To get this help, you need to get a request form and fill it. You can download it online (www.caf.fr) or go get one at the CAF office (the address is: 22, rue de Malville).

There is a page called "Attestation de loyer", you need to drop it off at the office of the residence, we'll fill it and give it back to you, then, you can send the request form.

Remember that you can only make this request after your arrival in France and once you have open a bank account.

Transport - Commun transport

The TAN is the company that organizes the public transport network around Nantes and its surrounding suburbs. It enable you to travel by Bus and Tram. Transport services work every day (exception made of the 1st of May, Christmas, demonstration days, etc...) from 4.15am until 0.30 the next day (2.30 am on Saturday).

In order to travel legally you have to use a ticket. There are tickets that last for an hour, a day, a week, a month or a year depending on what need.

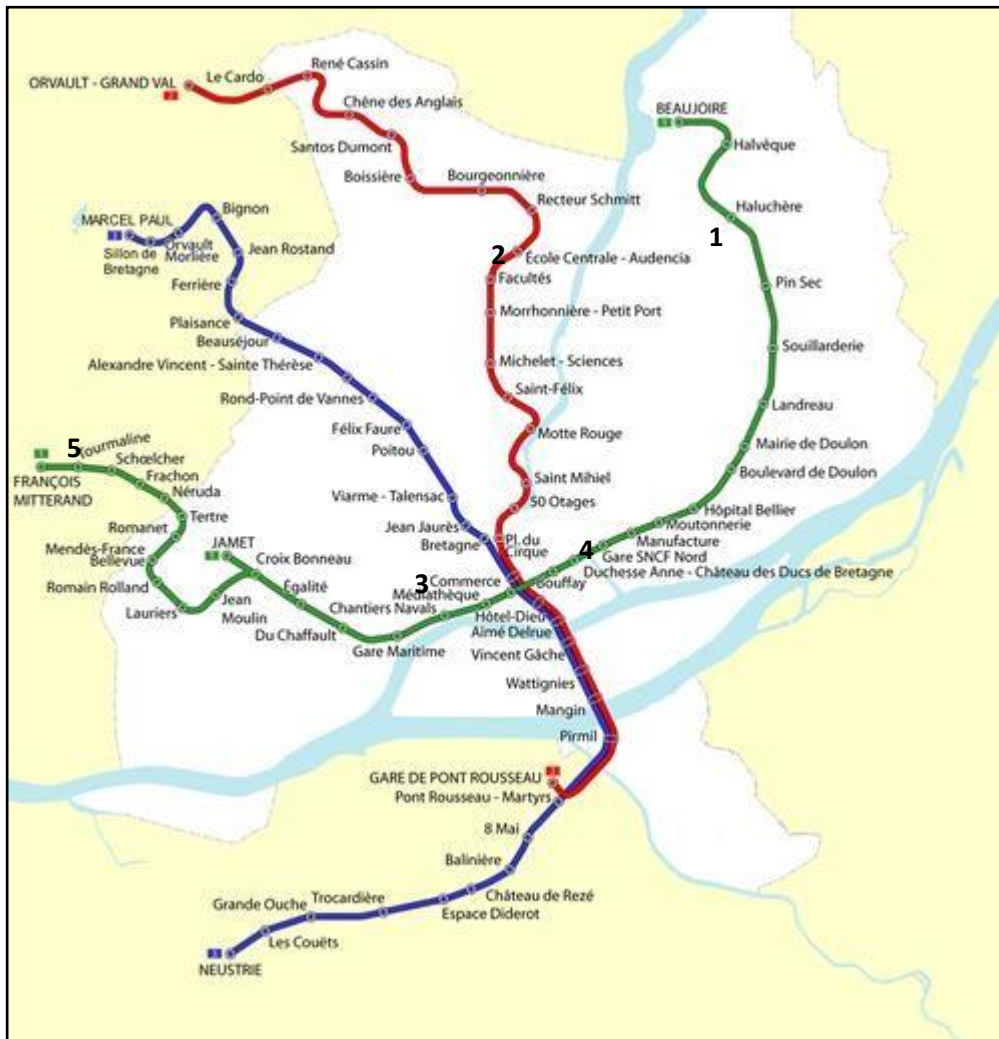
An hour ticket is valid for the bus and tram one hour after you stamp it when you get on the tram/bus (there are orange machines you slide your ticket into as soon as you get on).

- The 2 bus stop in front of the residence are : **Clétras** and **Chemin Rouge**

There are bus lines stopping there: 80, 85, 77

The bus 80 takes you to the schools, and to line 2 of tram.

- The nearest tram stop is **Haluchère** on line 1. You can go there walking (10minutes) or take 1 bus stop.

The bank system

In France the banking system is a little different in comparison with most of the other countries

1. Cheque:

Indeed, a very useful, quite indispensable, and very widely used means of payment is what we call a "cheque". It is often used instead of cash or when you can't pay with a credit card. In the residence, we only accept cheques and cash, it is therefore very important for you to open an account as soon as possible when you arrive in France.

Also you have to learn to write out a cheque and to learn to use cheques by making sure there is enough money on your account. The cheque will not be cashed most of the time for 2 or 3 days after you wrote it, this can lead to a few difficulties if you're not careful. The bank will refuse to pay the cheque if your account doesn't contain enough money and make you pay extra money for it.

The bank will provide you a cheque book (small book of cheques) when you open an account with them.

2. RIB

A R.I.B is the abbreviation for "Relevé d'Identité Bancaire". It's a paper on which your bank account number is written. The bank gives you some of them when you open your account. The CAF will also ask you one.

3. How to write out a French cheque

1 Payez contre cheque: This is where you fill in the amount on a French cheque - you can write the cents in letters or numbers. You can use the line below if needed.

2 €: the amount in numbers goes here - don't forget that in France it is normal to use a comma instead of a decimal point

3 A: Fill in the name of the person you want to make the cheque out to

4 Fait a: In here you write the name of the city that you are writing out the cheque in

5 Le: This is where the date goes

6 Signature: Sign here

Insurance

In France, it is compulsory to insure the apartment you are renting by an "assurance logement" or "assurance habitation multirisques". Regarding electricity and home insurance contracts, you will be contacted after booking by our Papernest concierge service included in the application fees for the subscription
